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



Heated gloves

Skiers, crossing guards and 'kou-kleumen', who always have cold fingers, will love the new paper in Applied Materials & Interfaces. A group of scientists from Massachusetts developed a nano-coated material that can be sown, weaved and, most importantly, electrically heated. Only a small current, provided by a battery of 1,8 grams, is needed to heat your fingers to the same temperature as your palm.


The current is not big enough to pass through your skin or hurt you. The coating consists of the polymer poly(3,4-ethylenedioxytiophene), also known as PEDOT.

And, to make it even more magical, the fabric can be sown together with normal thread when ripped. Now all we have to do is wait for it to be commercialised, so we never have to suffer from cold fingers again!

Non-toxic flame retardants

This news fact is for people who love to light some candles when it gets cold. Chemists from Empa have developed an environmentally friendly flame retardant. We need this flame retardant because the PU (polurethane) used in house façades, fridges, car seats, living room sofas and shoe soles, is highly flammable.

Before, foam manufacturers used toxic chlorinated phosphates as flame retardant. The new flame retardant EDA-DOPO, a derivative of the familiar flame retardant DOPO (9,10-dihydro-10-oxa-phosphaphenanthreneoxide) is not toxic and doesn't emit toxins when burned. The EDA-DOPO is currently still tested and the manufacturers are waiting for the needed certificate. The EDA-DOPO meets a lot of the requirements for flame retardants. It has the highest flame retardant classification, it is highly compatible with polyol, the base materials of PU foam and the flame retardant will distribute itself finely in all PU's pores.

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Chocolate Milk Disected: A Hot Cup of Chemicals

This year we've already past the vernal equinox and we're well on our way towards the winter solstice, meaning the days are shorter, the clothes warmer and the drinks hotter. Among those hot drinks there is one undisputed champion: hot chocolate. Part of enjoying the chocolate drink is getting lost in its lovely dark aroma, but what does this aroma consist of, and of what use would the aroma-active compounds be, if we were to unleash the mad scientist inside ourselves and extract them?

The elephant in the room is vanillin. This compound is present in a relatively high concentration and is a large contributor to the aroma, giving it a sweet, pleasant and, well, vanilla-like smell. So, what use does vanillin have aside from its taste and smell? Well, as it turns out vanillin makes for great and easy to make universal TLC stain, used to highlight those pesky compounds that won't light up under UV.

Hot chocolate doesn't have as light a smell as vanilla though, and the malty dark chocolate-like smell is largely supplied by the molecule 3-methylbutanal. 3-Methylbutanal is used to make pinacolone, a ketone with a peppermint-like smell, which in turn is used to make the herbicide metribuzin.

Aside from boasting a vanilla-like and malty smell, hot chocolate also carries a nice warm caramel-like smell. This fragrance is caused by maltol, which is found in roasted malt, hence the name. Under specific circumstances maltol has the ability to make the polypeptide nisin act as an effective antibiotic for E.coli.




Figure 1: f.l.t.r. Maltol, Vanillin

Although the compounds mentioned above are present in barely relevant amounts it's still a fun idea to consider that you could be treating someone's E.coli infection while running a stained TLC of the herbicide you just synthesised, with the compounds in the cup of hot cocoa you just poured.

So next time you pour a hot cup of coco, remember you could also be treating someone's E.coli infection while running a stained TLC of your freshly made herbicide.

Japanese Curry

For 4 persons

Onion

1 apple

2 sweet potatoes

1 package of Japanese curry paste (You can buy this at the Toko in 3 types of spiciness. Hot mild and none. Remember, this is 'Japanese spicy' so it is not comparable to Indian curry)

Rice

100 grams frozen Edamame or peas

200 grams chicken thighs

1.5 cups of water

2 carrots

a tumb of ginger

vegetable oil

gerlic

honey

soy sauce

fish sauce

2 eggs

salt and pepper



Mise en place

Chop the apple, sweet potatoes, carrots, garlic and onions in small parts of about 1 by 1 centimeter. The chicken should be chopped in bigger parts.

Let's start cooking

Firstly, bake the onions and carrots for 5 minutes in a large pan until the onion becomes translucent in the vegetable oil. Bake the chicken with the onions and carrots together with the garlic and ginger until the chicken is baked properly. Add the water, curry paste, Apple and the sweet potato and boil the mixture for 20 minutes until the potato is cooked properly. Japanese curry should have a high viscosity comparable to a soup. This is what you aim for and therefore you might have to add more water. Start boiling the rice when the potatoes are in the pan for 5 minutes. When the potato is almost cooked properly add the edamame for some more veggies and cook them about 2 minutes. Finally, for further seasoning you can add honey, soy sauce, fish sauce or salt and pepper.
